Do you relate well to young people aged between 15-25 years?
Are you available Monday evenings between 6:30 – 9:30?

Family Access Network (FAN) works with young people aged between 15-25 years who may be experiencing social isolation and as a result we are currently recruiting volunteers who are able to act as mentors as part of a Volunteer Support Team (VST).

Volunteers work as part of a close knit team and are attached to an allocated supported accommodation student house with either 2-3 male or female students. There is no typical evening at the houses, however both clients and volunteers will collectively participate in a range of activities, whether that is learning how to cook meals, budgeting skills or assisting with homework.

In order to be considered as a potential volunteer, applicants are required to ideally be over the age of 25, either be a student or previously studied and have some experience and/or relate well with young people aged 15-25 years. Must also be available every Monday evenings between 6:30-9:30 for a minimum of 12 months, have own transport and demonstrate reliability.

This is an invaluable opportunity to make a difference to the lives of young people and regular support and ongoing training is provided.

FAN is committed to providing a child safe environment and all volunteers are required to undertake mandatory Working With Children and National Police checks.

Volunteer Support Team – (VST) GLBTI

Do you relate well to young people aged between 15-25 years?
Are you available Monday evenings between 6:30 – 9:30?

Family Access Network (FAN) works with young people aged between 15-25 years who may be experiencing social isolation and as a result we are currently recruiting volunteers who are able to act as mentors as part of a Volunteer Support Team (VST).

Volunteers work as part of a close knit team and are attached to an allocated supported accommodation same sex attracted house of up to 3 young people. There is no typical evening at the houses, however both clients and volunteers will collectively participate in a range of activities, whether that is learning how to cook meals, budgeting skills or assisting with homework and/or job searching.

In order to be considered as a potential volunteer, applicants are required to ideally be over the age of 25, have some experience and relate well with young people aged 15-25 years. Must also be available every Monday evenings between 6:30-9:30 for a minimum of 12 months, have reliable transport and demonstrate reliability.

This is an invaluable opportunity to make a difference to the lives of young people and regular support and ongoing training is provided.

FAN is committed to providing a child safe environment and all volunteers are required to undertake mandatory Working With Children and National Police checks.

Lead Tenant (female)

FAN provides a range of transitional housing and support for young people aged 15-25 years whom may be experiencing homelessness or at risk. We are currently looking for a female to become a voluntary live in Lead Tenant in an all female student house.

This voluntary role is *rent free, with no utility bills*. Share in a comfortable 3 bedroom property located in Camberwell, close to public transport. The Lead Tenant is a valued member of the team who is required to role model every day living conditions in a shared accommodation environment and is ideally suited to someone whom is either working or studying and has an interest in making a difference to the lives of young people. You would be sharing with two female who are experiencing homelessness and other challenges. The young people receive a case managed response from FAN Youth Support Workers, therefore the Lead Tenant is not expected to take on the role of staff, but support a stable and safe environment where regular training and support will be provided.

FAN is committed to providing a safe environment and all volunteers are required to undertake a Working with Children and National Police Records Check.

The Lead Tenant is to sign a lease agreement and a 12 month commitment to FAN is required.

Volunteer Support Team – (VST) young family houses

Do you relate well to young people aged between 15-25 years?
Are you available Monday evenings between 6:30 – 9:30?

Family Access Network (FAN) works with young people aged between 15-25 years who may be experiencing social isolation and as a result we are currently recruiting volunteers who are able to act as mentors as part of a Volunteer Support Team (VST).

Volunteers work as part of a close knit team and are attached to allocated supported accommodation family houses that comprises of couples and accompanying children up to school age. There is no typical evening at the houses; however both clients and volunteers will collectively participate in a range of activities, whether that is learning how to cook meals, budgeting skills or role modelling appropriate parenting/child knowledge.

In order to be considered as a potential volunteer, applicants are required to ideally (but not necessarily) be over the age of 25, either be a parent and/or have experience with children. Relating well with young people aged 15-25 years is also a requirement, together with being available every Monday evenings between 6:30-9:30 for a minimum of 12 months, have reliable transport and demonstrate reliability.

This is an invaluable opportunity to make a difference to the lives of young people and regular support and ongoing training is provided.

FAN is committed to providing a child safe environment and all volunteers are required to undertake mandatory Working With Children and National Police checks.
