The term dual diagnosis is most commonly used to describe a person who is experiencing issues with both their mental health and substance use.

HYDDI aims to:

Improve the outcomes for young people who are homeless and are experiencing the impact of dual diagnosis by....

- Ongoing and helpful partnerships between mental health, drug and alcohol and homeless services
- Building the capacity of the homeless youth sector to respond to the needs of young people who are experiencing homelessness and have co-occurring mental health and substance use concerns.

HYDDI offers the following services to all Youth Specialist Homelessness Services (SHS) in the Eastern DHHS regions of Melbourne.

- Primary consultations; offering a specialist mental health and substance use assessment
- Secondary Consultation: ideas/advice on brief interventions, management options, eg: medication, counselling, harm minimisation strategies
- Support and advocacy to access mental health and alcohol other drug services
- Education, training and capacity building of staff around issues of Dual Diagnosis
- Individual and group support for workers on working with clients with a Dual Diagnosis
